The operation of heavy equipment, like for instance cranes, needs safety training. Licensing for crane operators combines on-the-job supervised work and specialized training programs. These training programs are offered by industry training and certification organizations. The content of crane operator training programs could vary depending on the requirements and laws of the local industry.

Certification and training could be provided for various kinds of cranes, including overhead cranes, mobile cranes, articulator cranes and tower cranes. Overhead cranes are usually made use of in the manufacturing business. Mobile cranes transport heavy equipment to locations where the work should be carried out. Articulator cranes are made use of in order to load equipment and materials onto truck beds and various heavy machinery. The tower crane are the biggest kind of crane, usually found in large sea ports.

The crane department supervisor will normally have the authority to offer essential hands-on crane training, in the manufacturing trade. After the practical part, the trainee may need to pass a course. Upon successfully completing the course, the person training would be certified or licensed.

Simulated crane operator training is provided in several industrial environments, that enables operators the ability to gain hands-on skills without putting other equipment and employees at risk. The simulated environment provides a set of virtual activities making use of a simulated crane, including realistic controls. By mastering crane operation in simulated training, the operator could operate real cranes on the job.

Once licensed and certified, crane operators must partake in continuing education in order to regularly upgrade their skills and knowledge. On-going crane operator training is often recommended for technicians so they can know updates in crane technology and safety features.
