Telehandler Training Courses Oshawa - Employers are responsible for making sure that their supervisory and operating personnel are trained to work competently using telehandler equipment. The competence level of employees need to be assessed. If deficiencies are found, employers need to provide training so that employees attain the required level of skill. The responsibility level of the person must be taken into consideration when training is offered. Effective training will remedy whichever deficiencies in the knowledge, skills and understanding of telehandler operators and supervisors. Training can be undertaken by hiring an external training provider or through in-house sessions. An assessment upon finishing the training period would determine if the learning objectives have been met or not.

Guidelines and regulations for the basic telehandler operator training and testing are set by federal, state/provincial and local regulators. Basic training does not address such topics as the lifting of suspended loads, the lifting of people, the use of rotating machines or using various attachments. Further training will have to be undertaken if such tasks are required on the work site.

Inspection and maintenance

Like whichever machinery, a telehandler requires effective maintenance. The machinery inevitably would suffer wear over time. Proper maintenance is essential to ensuring safe use of the telehandler machinery. Inspections and checks are essential to ongoing maintenance measures. Operators must have machine-specific training in order to monitor, prevent and rectify problems connected with damage, wear and deterioration. Staff need competence and experience in both periodic and breakdown maintenance. The preventive maintenance instructions of the manufacturer must be viewed seriously and followed, considering such factors as frequency of use and environmental conditions in the work setting.

The user of the equipment along with the owner of the equipment share the responsibility for making certain that the telehandler is in full working condition. Pre-use checks are usually performed by the user, whilst general maintenance is usually done by the telehandler owner.
