Forklift License Oshawa - Obtaining a forklift license or forklift certification in North America would require the trainee to do classroom instruction in addition to hands-on training. The federal, state and provincial regulatory bodies are responsible for the training, licensing and certification for powered industrial truck operators. Operators can get a license either by a third party or through training administered by the employer. In any case, regulatory requirements should be met. Recertification is necessary every two to three years.

The lift truck is a powered industrial machine which is designed with various options, like sit-down and stand-up models, propane and electric versions, and different sizes and types to meet the industrial needs of workers. Operator training programs are normally individualized to be able address the specific uses and kinds for which the operator is training. Training on a sit-down, gas-powered lift truck inside a warehouse setting will not be the same as training on a propane-powered, stand-up forklift in a shipyard. The various lift trucks and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all machines and businesses. Regulatory standards, thus, have a tendency not to concentrate on detailed course requirements but instead on the results of individual training programs.

Employer-provided, on-the-job training is the most common method for operators to be given their forklift certification or license. This method of certification requires the employer to provide practical training and classroom sessions on equipment in the workplace. Employers can choose to train personnel on each type of forklift separately, or to train them on all machines combined. The course incorporates forklift operation procedures, lift truck maintenance, safety procedures and company regulations. Subject matters particular to the worksite, like for instance dangerous conditions or materials, must be included. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely use and operate every kind of lift truck on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor normally needs an on-site component together with hands-on practice.

Normally, a certification provided by an employer will not transfer from the existing employer to the next employer. Receiving a lift truck license through employer-provided training enables the operator to operate a forklift for that employer only.

Forklift safety would always be an essential factor of the lift truck license training, even though the particulars of the safety training would be dependent upon the machines being utilized. Some safety issues would differ for every employer and industry. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers may have to deal with additional requirements for safety training in applicable businesses, like in marine and offshore operations.
